Pentecost Sunday



Pentecost wraps up the end of our Easter Season. While it marks the end of Easter in the Catholic calendar, it also marks the beginning of something else. Mary & the other apostles were gathered together in Jerusalem praying on the Jewish feast of Pentecost which marked the original celebration of Moses receiving the Ten Commandments from God when suddenly a sound came from heaven like a rushing wind and it filled the home they were in. "tongues of fire" rested upon each of them and they began to speak in other languages as the Holy Spirit allowed. The Jews surrounding the home began to come close and assumed that the disciples had been drinking. Saint Peter assured the crowd that they were filled with the Holy Spirit and in turn three thousand people were baptized that day! Many call this the "birthday of the church" Liturgical Living, In our home we like to bake a birthday cake in honor of the beginning of our church and last year we cut out little apostles to place on top like cake toppers. I originally tried to put candles behind each of their heads but after nearly catching each one on fire, I figured with 3 you got the idea! other ideas include, having a bonfire, roasting hot dogs or marshmallows over the open flames or simply having a spicy snack! There are many ways in which we can remember that we are Pentecost people in this world. Here are some of the Bible's reminders:

The sign of the dove

And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove upon him. MARK 1:10

At the baptism of Jesus, the Holy Spirit descended as a dove upon him, and we who have been baptized into Christ are blessed by the sight of doves from time to time to remind us that the Spirit has landed upon us as well.

Tongues of fire

Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. ACTS 2:3

The tongues of fire that appeared over the heads of the disciples at Pentecost revealed their burning desire to share Jesus. When we see a campfire or candle burning, we remember that the Spirit's fire is in us, too, to share.

And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. ACTS 2:2



This Week's Featured Feast Day Saint Anthony of Padua Patron of the Poor



Feast Day: June 13th

Anthony's parents were very rich and wanted him to be a great nobleman. But he wanted to be poor for the sake of Jesus Christ, so he became a Franciscan.


Anthony was a great preacher. He was sent out as a missionary and preached in many cities in Italy and France. He brough many sinners back to God mostly by his good example.

One day, when Anthony was praying in his room, the Infant Jesus appeared to him, put His little arms around his neck, and kissed him. This wonderful favor was given to him because he kept his soul free from even the smalledst sin and because he loved Jesus very much.

When he became ill he went to a monastery outside of Padua, where he prepared for death.

Many miracles took place after his death on June 13, 1231. Even today he is called the "wonder-worker." He was only 36 years old when he died. 32 years after his death his remains were brought to Padua. The flesh was all consumed except the tongue, which was found red and fresh as it was while he was living.

Almighty, ever-living God, You gave Your people the extraordinary preacher St. Anthony and made him an intercessor in difficulties. By his aid grant that we may live a truly Christian life and experience Your help in all adversities.


