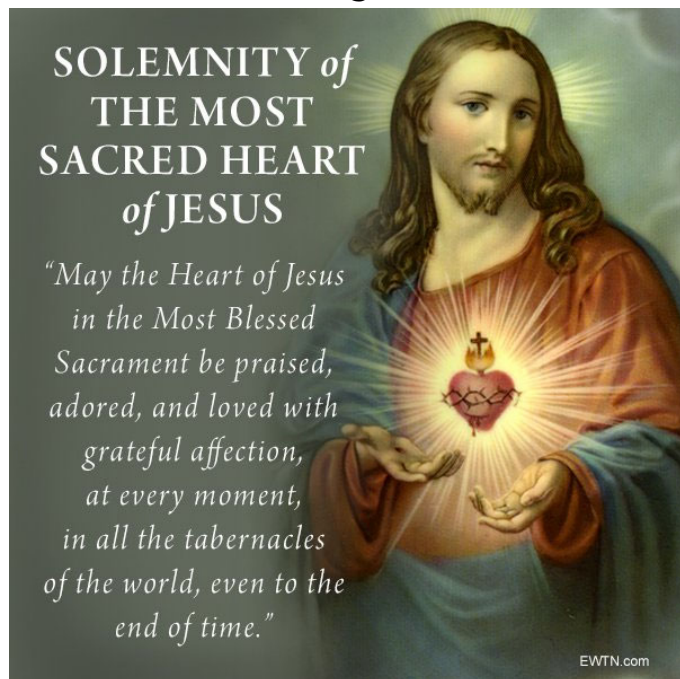

Solemnity to the Sacred Heart of Jesus is on Friday, June 27th



Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus goes back at least to the 11th century, but through the 16th century, it remained a private devotion, often tied to devotion to the Five Wounds of Christ. The first feast of the Sacred Heart was celebrated on August 31, 1670, in Rennes, France, through the efforts of Fr. Jean Eudes (1602-1680). From Rennes, the devotion spread, but it took the visions of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque (1647-1690) for the devotion to become universal.

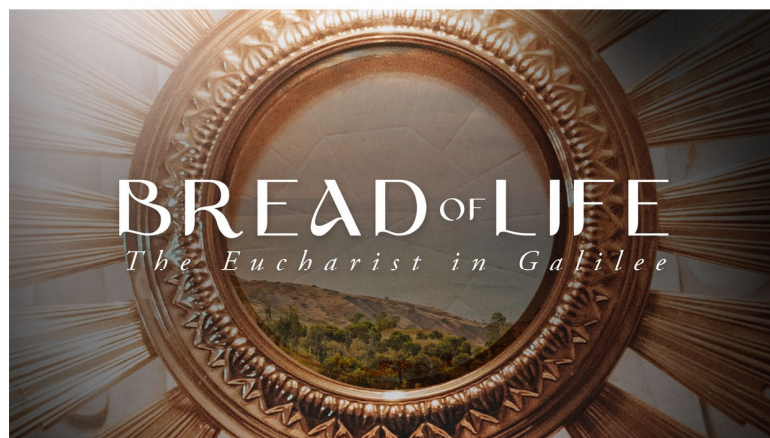
In all of these visions, in which Jesus appeared to St. Margaret Mary, the Sacred Heart of Jesus played a central role. The "great apparition," which took place on June 16, 1675, during the octave of the Feast of Corpus Christi, is the source of the modern Feast of the Sacred Heart. In that vision, Christ asked St. Margaret Mary to request that the Feast of the Sacred Heart be celebrated on the Friday after the octave (or eighth day) of the Feast of Corpus Christi, in reparation for the ingratitude of men for the sacrifice that Christ had made for them. The Sacred Heart of Jesus represents not simply His physical heart but His love for all mankind.

The devotion became quite popular after St. Margaret Mary's death in 1690, but, because the Church initially had doubts about the validity of St. Margaret Mary's visions, it wasn't until 1765 that the feast was celebrated officially in France. Almost 100 years later, in 1856, Pope Pius IX, at the request of the French bishops, extended the feast to the universal Church. It is celebrated on the day requested by our Lord—the Friday after the octave of Corpus Christi, or 19 days after Pentecost Sunday.

This Week's Featured Feast Day

The Nativity of St. John the Baptist

Feast Day: June 24th



John was the son of the priest Zechariah. His birth was foretold by the Angel Gabriel during a vision to Zechariah in the Temple. His mother is Saint Elizabeth, a relative of the Virgin Mary. She believed she would never have children before the Lord answered her prayers for a son. We do not know the exact date of Saint John's birth, but the Church celebrates his Nativity on June 24th. The Church bases this celebration on the Annunciation (March 25th). Scripture says Saint John's mother was in her sixth month of pregnancy when the angel appeared to Mary. (Luke 1:26-27) The Gospel of Luke references the birth of Saint John. His is one of three birthdays celebrated on the Church's liturgical calendar. The other two are Jesus' birth and the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary. He leaped in his mother's womb at the Visitation making him the first person to recognize the child Jesus!

John lived in the desert as a hermit for years before taking his ministry. He ate only locusts and wild honey and never touched strong drink. He wore a rough garment of camel's skin. His hair reached his shoulders. At the River Jordan John cried out: "Do penance, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand! I am the voice of one crying in the wilderness. Make straight the way of the Lord." Large crowds were baptized by him as a sign of penance.

John pointed to Jesus with the words, "Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world!" And when John poured water over the head of Jesus as a sign of penance, the Holy Spirit appeared in the form of a dove, and the Heavenly Father said, "This is My Beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased."

"Looking at the events (of Christ's baptism) in light of the Cross and Resurrection, the Christian people realized what happened: Jesus loaded the burden of all mankind's guilt upon his shoulders; he bore it down into the depths of the Jordan." – Pope Benedict XVI

When John warned King Herod that it was not lawful for him to have his brother's wife, he was thrown into prison. Later the king had him beheaded. Our Lord said of John: "Among those that are born of women, there is not a greater prophet than John the Baptist."

"No one can receive anything except what has been given him from heaven. You yourselves can testify that I said [that] I am not the Messiah, but that I was sent before Him. The one who has the bride is the bridegroom; the best man, who stands and listens to Him, rejoices greatly at the bridegroom's voice. So this joy of mine has been made complete. He must increase; I must decrease."

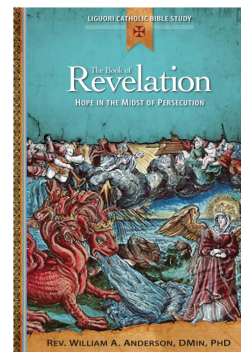
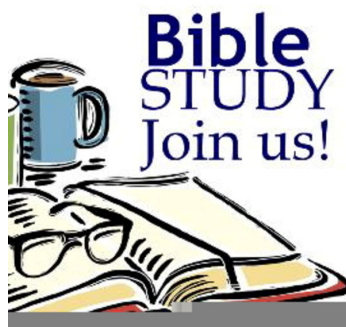
