












This Week's Featured Feast Day



Feast Day: September 27

St. Vincent de Paul, born in France in 1581, is remembered as one of the greatest saints of charity in the Catholic Church. He grew up in a modest farming family and was ordained a priest at a young age. While he initially hoped to find success and comfort in the priesthood, his life took a dramatic turn when he was captured by pirates and sold into slavery in North Africa. After escaping and returning to France, Vincent dedicated himself more fully to the service of God, especially through ministering to the poor and marginalized. This experience changed the course of his life, transforming him into a champion of charity.

During his ministry, St. Vincent de Paul worked tirelessly to meet the spiritual and material needs of the poor. He founded the Congregation of the Mission, known as the Vincentians, to train priests and missionaries for work among the poor and in rural areas. With the help of St. Louise de Marillac, he also established the Daughters of Charity, a community of women devoted to serving those in need. His efforts helped reform the clergy, improve the education of seminarians, and encourage the laity to live out their faith through active works of mercy.

St. Vincent's legacy is one of practical love. He believed that charity should be organized, efficient, and rooted in true compassion for every person's dignity. His influence spread far beyond France, and today his example inspires countless Catholic organizations dedicated to helping the poor. The Society of St. Vincent de Paul, founded in the 19th century by Blessed Frédéric Ozanam, continues his mission around the world, providing food, shelter, and aid to the needy. His life demonstrates how faith and action go hand in hand in living out the Gospel.

The Church celebrates the Feast of St. Vincent de Paul on September 27th each year. This day invites Catholics to reflect on his extraordinary service and to consider how they, too, can put love into action. His feast is not only a day to honor him but also a call to renew one's own commitment to works of mercy.

Catholics can celebrate his feast day in many meaningful ways. Some might choose to volunteer at a local food pantry, shelter, or soup kitchen, echoing Vincent's care for the poor. Families can pray together for those in need and learn more about his life to inspire acts of kindness. Parishes might organize collections for clothing or food drives or support local branches of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul. On a personal level, Catholics can perform simple acts of charity, such as visiting someone who is lonely, offering encouragement, or giving generously to a charitable cause. In these ways, the faithful honor St. Vincent not only with words but with actions, just as he would have wanted.
