












This Week's Featured Feast Day



Feast Day: October 4th

Saint Francis of Assisi, born in 1181 or 1182 in Assisi, Italy, is one of the most beloved saints in the Catholic Church. As a young man, Francis lived a wealthy and carefree life, but after a profound conversion experience, he gave up his riches and devoted himself entirely to God. He embraced a life of poverty, humility, and service, modeling himself after Christ. In 1209, he founded the Order of Friars Minor, commonly known as the Franciscans, who continue to live out his spirit of simplicity and charity. His radical love for the poor, the sick, and all of creation remains a lasting witness to Christian discipleship.

One of the most remarkable aspects of Saint Francis' spirituality was his deep connection to nature. He saw all creatures as his brothers and sisters, calling the sun his "brother" and the moon his "sister." This love for creation was not simply poetic but rooted in his understanding that all life reflects the goodness of God. His *Canticle of the Sun* is a hymn of praise that captures this profound awareness of God's presence in the natural world. Because of this, Francis is often regarded as the patron saint of ecology and animals, inspiring Catholics to care for the earth as part of their faith.


Saint Francis also received the stigmata, the wounds of Christ, on Mount La Verna in 1224, becoming the first known person to bear them. This mystical gift was a sign of his deep union with the suffering of Jesus. Despite his physical pain, Francis remained joyful, humble, and committed to his mission of preaching the Gospel. He died in 1226 and was canonized just two years later, in 1228, by Pope Gregory IX. Today, countless Catholics and non-Catholics alike are moved by his example of simplicity, peace, and love.


The feast day of Saint Francis of Assisi is celebrated on October 4th. Many Catholic parishes mark this day with the "Blessing of the Animals," where people bring their pets and animals to church to receive a special blessing in honor of Francis' love for God's creatures. Families can also celebrate by spending time outdoors, appreciating the beauty of creation, or even volunteering in ways that care for the environment. His feast day is a reminder that our faith is lived out not only in prayer but also in how we treat the world around us.

Catholics can also honor Saint Francis by practicing acts of charity and simplicity in their daily lives. Donating to the poor, visiting the sick, or reducing excess material possessions are all ways to imitate his spirit. Reading his prayers, such as the *Prayer of St. Francis* ("Lord, make me an instrument of your peace"), can inspire individuals and families to live with greater peace and compassion. Ultimately, celebrating Saint Francis' feast day is an opportunity to embrace his message of humility, care for creation, and deep love for Christ and others.
