This Week's Featured Feast Days



All Saints' Day, celebrated each year on November 1st, is a solemn holy day in the Catholic Church dedicated to honoring all the saints-known and unknown—who have attained heaven. It is a day to recognize the countless men and women who lived lives of heroic virtue and faith, many of whom may never have been formally canonized. The feast reminds the faithful of the Church's teaching on the Communion of Saints, the spiritual union of all believers—those on earth, in purgatory, and in heaven—who are bound together in Christ's love. It is also a time to reflect on the universal call to holiness and to be inspired by the examples of the saints who lived ordinary lives in extraordinary ways.

Catholics can celebrate All Saints' Day by attending Mass, as it is a Holy Day of **Obligation** in many countries, including the United States. During Mass, special prayers and readings focus on the hope of eternal life and the joy of heaven. Families can also honor their favorite saints by reading their stories, praying for their intercession, or displaying images or statues of saints in their homes. Schools and parishes often host "saint fairs" or costume events for children, where they can dress as their favorite saints and learn about their lives of faith and service.

At home, Catholics can extend the celebration by praying the Litany of the Saints, lighting a candle in honor of departed loved ones, or visiting cemeteries to pray for the dead in anticipation of All Souls' Day on November 2nd. Some families also prepare a special meal or dessert associated with a saint's country or tradition, connecting faith with culture and daily life. Above all, All Saints' Day is an invitation for every Catholic to grow closer to God, imitate the saints' virtues, and strive for the holiness to which each person is called.



All Souls' Day, celebrated on **November 2nd**, is a special day in the Catholic Church dedicated to praying for all the faithful departed—those souls who have died and are still being purified in purgatory before entering heaven. This feast follows immediately after All Saints' Day and reflects the Church's deep belief in the Communion of Saints, which unites the faithful on earth, the souls in purgatory, and the saints in heaven. It is a day of remembrance, hope, and mercy, as Catholics intercede for their loved ones and all souls who await the fullness of God's presence.

Catholics celebrate All Souls' Day primarily by attending Mass and offering prayers for the deceased. Many visit cemeteries to clean and decorate graves with flowers or candles, turning these visits into moments of prayer and reflection. The Church also encourages acts of charity and offering indulgences for the souls in purgatory during the first days of November. These prayers and sacrifices are seen as expressions of love that help the departed draw nearer to the joy of eternal life with God.

At home, families can commemorate All Souls' Day by creating a prayer altar or remembrance table with photos of deceased loved ones, lighting candles, and reciting prayers such as the Eternal Rest Prayer ("Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord..."). Reading Scripture passages about resurrection and eternal life or praying the Rosary for the souls of the departed are also meaningful ways to honor the day. Above all, All Souls' Day reminds Catholics of the Christian hope in the resurrection and the power of prayer to unite and heal across the boundaries of life and death.

November is a time to remember the faithful departed. During the month of November, we are called in a special way to remember our loved ones who have gone to their rest. The month of November especially All Soul's Day is a traditional time for visiting the graves of loved ones, as is the anniversary of their death. Let us remember the Souls in Purgatory in our prayers and they will surely intercede for us in union with our Blessed Mother and all the Saints.

Please join our parish community on November 2nd at 10:00am as we remember our departed family members and friends. We will be giving special honor to our parishioners who passed away this past year.
