



This Week's Featured Feast Days



Feast Day: November 21

The Feast of the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary is celebrated each year on November 21. This feast commemorates the tradition that Mary, as a young girl, was presented by her parents, Saints Joachim and Anne, to God in the Temple of Jerusalem. Though this event is not recorded in Scripture, it is found in ancient writings such as the Protoevangelium of James, which describes Mary's early dedication to the Lord. The Church celebrates this feast as a reminder of Mary's total consecration to God from her earliest years, prefiguring her "yes" to God at the Annunciation.

This feast highlights Mary's deep faith, purity, and willingness to give her life entirely to God's service. From her childhood, Mary was prepared by grace to be the Mother of Jesus Christ, the Savior of the world. Her presentation in the Temple signifies the beginning of a life lived wholly for God, setting an example of devotion, humility, and obedience for all Christians. It also points to the importance of offering oneself to God's will, trusting that His plan leads to holiness and fulfillment.

Liturgically, the Feast of the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary is celebrated with joy and reverence. At Mass, special readings and prayers honor Mary as a model of consecration and faith. Many Catholic parishes and religious communities use this day to renew vows or make spiritual offerings to God through Mary's intercession. In some places, children and young people are encouraged to learn about Mary's life and virtues, reminding them of her role as a loving and faithful disciple of Christ.

Catholics can celebrate this feast day in their homes by praying the Rosary or the Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary, reflecting on Mary's example of total dedication to God. Families might also set aside time for quiet prayer, perhaps lighting a candle near an image or statue of Mary to symbolize her light and holiness. Reading Scripture passages that focus on Mary's faith, such as Luke 1:26-38 (the Annunciation) or Luke 1:46-55 (the Magnificat), helps deepen appreciation for her role in salvation history.

Ultimately, the Feast of the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary calls all Catholics to imitate Mary's openness to God's will. Just as Mary was presented and offered to the Lord, the faithful are invited to renew their own dedication to God's purposes in their lives. Through prayer, worship, and acts of love, Catholics honor Mary's life of faith and seek to follow her example of joyful surrender to the divine plan.
