



This Week's Featured Feast Days



Feast Day: November 23rd

The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe—often called Christ the King—is celebrated on the final Sunday of the liturgical year. Instituted in 1925 by Pope Pius XI through the encyclical Quas Primas, the feast was created in response to growing secularism and the diminishing sense of Christ's authority in society. By placing this solemnity at the end of the Church year, the Church emphasizes the ultimate truth that Christ reigns over all creation, and that His Kingdom is one of justice, mercy, and love. The feast redirects Christians to the reality that no earthly power holds lasting dominion compared to Christ's eternal kingship.

This solemnity also reminds Catholics that Christ's kingship is not like worldly authority. Jesus reigns from the Cross, showing that true power is exercised through sacrifice, humility, and self-giving love. His Kingdom is not built on domination or fear but on service, forgiveness, and the transformation of hearts. The readings for the day often highlight themes of divine sovereignty, the shepherd-like care of Christ for His people, and the ultimate gathering of all creation under His rule. Meditating on these themes helps believers deepen their understanding of what it means to acknowledge Jesus as Lord of every aspect of

Catholics can celebrate this feast by participating in Mass with special intention and awareness, paying close attention to the prayers that speak of Christ's universal reign. Many parishes include solemn music, Eucharistic adoration, or processions to honor the Kingship of Christ. Families might prepare by praying the Liturgy of the Hours or reading the Gospel accounts that speak directly of Jesus' authority, such as His dialogue with Pilate in John 18. These practices highlight the spiritual significance of the day and reconnect believers with Christ's central place in the Church's life.

Another meaningful way to celebrate is by enthroning Christ as King within the home. Some Catholic families use the day to designate a prominent place for an image of the Sacred Heart or Christ the King, renewing their commitment to live according to His teachings. This can be accompanied by a short prayer service, Scripture reading, or an act of consecration to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Such gestures symbolize the family's desire to place Christ at the center of their daily decisions, values, and relationships.

Works of charity also beautifully express loyalty to Christ the King. Since His Kingdom is marked by justice, mercy, and care for the vulnerable, Catholics can honor the feast by visiting the sick, supporting those in need, or donating to charitable causes. These acts show concrete allegiance to the King who identifies Himself with "the least of these." By extending Christ's love to others, believers participate in building up His Kingdom on earth and recognizing His presence in everyone they encounter.

Finally, Christ the King is an invitation to reflect on the direction of one's life as the Church year closes. It is a moment to ask whether Christ truly reigns in one's thoughts, choices, and priorities. Catholics can use the day to make a spiritual examen, go to confession, or renew personal commitments to prayer and discipleship. By ending the liturgical year with Christ's kingship, the Church encourages believers to begin Advent with hearts focused, renewed, and ready to welcome the King who comes to save.



November is a time to remember the faithful departed. During the month of November, we are called in a special way to remember our loved ones who have gone to their rest. The month of November especially All Soul's Day is a traditional time for visiting the graves of loved ones, as is the anniversary of their death. Let us remember the Souls in Purgatory in our prayers and they will surely intercede for us in union with our Blessed Mother and all the Saints.-*


