

This Week's Featured Feast Days



The Feast of St. Nicholas, celebrated each year on December 6th, honors one of the most beloved saints of the Christian tradition. St. Nicholas of Myra, a 4thcentury bishop, is remembered for his deep charity, his defense of the faith, and his compassion for the poor. Though many people today associate him with the modern figure of Santa Claus, the real St. Nicholas was a courageous shepherd of his flock who stood firmly for Christ during times of persecution and heresy. His generosity became legendary, especially his practice of giving aid anonymously so that the dignity of the poor would be protected.

One of the most famous stories about St. Nicholas involves three young women whose father could not afford dowries for them to marry. Nicholas secretly tossed bags of gold through their window at night, providing what they needed without seeking recognition. This act not only saved the family from desperation, but also set the tone for the saint's legacy of discreet generosity. Catholics today look to this example as an invitation to see the needs around them and respond with quiet, thoughtful charity.

The feast day also highlights St. Nicholas's role as a defender of the faith. Tradition holds that he was present at the Council of Nicaea in 325, where he opposed the Arian heresy, which denied the divinity of Christ. Whether or not all the details of these stories are historically precise, they reflect a deeper truth: St. Nicholas was a bishop deeply committed to upholding the mystery of the Incarnation. His feast day reminds Catholics to remain steadfast in professing and living the truths of the faith with courage and humility.

Catholics can celebrate the Feast of St. Nicholas by practicing acts of generosity, especially toward the poor. Many families place shoes by the door the night before, a nod to European tradition, and fill them with small treats, coins, or handwritten notes of encouragement. This simple gesture teaches children—and adults—to give with joy, and to receive with gratitude. It also creates a moment to talk about why generosity is a form of Christian love.

Another meaningful way to celebrate is by performing an anonymous act of kindness in St. Nicholas's honor. Donating to a charity, slipping a grocery card into someone's mailbox, or supporting a family in need reflects the saint's spirit of hidden generosity. Some parishes also organize toy or food drives during early Advent, offering Catholics an opportunity to share Christ's love in a very tangible way.

Finally, Catholics may honor St. Nicholas by attending Mass, praying the Litany of St. Nicholas, or reading a short biography of his life as part of a family prayer time. Preparing a festive meal, baking traditional European treats such as speculaas or gingerbread, or lighting a candle before an icon of the saint can also deepen the celebration. However it is observed, the Feast of St. Nicholas invites Catholics to begin Advent with hearts ready to give, defend the faith, and imitate Christ through generosity and compassion.




