

This Week's Featured Feast Days



St. Stephen

Feast Day: December 26

Saint Stephen, honored as the first Christian martyr, holds a special place in the early Church's history. Chosen as one of the first seven deacons, he was entrusted with serving the poor and assisting the Apostles in their ministry. Stephen was known for his profound wisdom, deep faith, and powerful preaching, which stirred both admiration and controversy. His defense of the Gospel before the Sanhedrin revealed his intimate understanding of salvation history and his unwavering love for Christ. Ultimately, Stephen's martyrdom—stoned to death as he proclaimed his vision of Jesus at the right hand of the Father—became a model of Christian courage.


In his final moments, Stephen imitated Christ in a remarkable way. He prayed for his persecutors, asking God not to hold their actions against them. This act of mercy reveals his profound holiness and the transformative power of God's grace. His death also intersected with the story of St. Paul, who witnessed the stoning; tradition holds that Stephen's prayer helped sow the seeds of Paul's later conversion. Stephen's witness reminds Catholics that the path of discipleship often involves sacrifice, forgiveness, and steadfast faith.

The Feast of Saint Stephen is celebrated on December 26 in the Roman Catholic Church, inviting the faithful to reflect on the cost of discipleship even as the joy of Christmas continues. Celebrating Stephen's feast day during the Octave of Christmas highlights the close connection between Christ's birth and the call to follow Him with integrity and courage. It also draws attention to the early Church's commitment to justice and charity, virtues Stephen embodied as a deacon.

Catholics can celebrate this feast day by engaging in acts of charity, following Stephen's example of caring for the marginalized. Donating to a food pantry, supporting local shelters, or offering help to someone in need honors his ministry of service. Families may also choose to prepare a simple meal and share it with a neighbor or someone who might be lonely during the holidays. These gestures reflect Stephen's heart for the poor and the vulnerable.

Prayer is another meaningful way to honor Saint Stephen. Attending daily Mass on December 26, praying the Liturgy of the Hours, or offering a rosary for those suffering persecution deepens one's connection to Stephen's spirit of faithfulness. Reading the account of his martyrdom in Acts 6–7 can also inspire personal reflection on the courage required to live the Gospel. Asking Stephen's intercession for the grace to forgive others—even in difficult circumstances—makes this feast spiritually fruitful.

Finally, families and individuals can make Saint Stephen's Day a time to cultivate a spirit of peace and reconciliation. Writing a note of forgiveness, making amends with someone, or offering prayers for those who have caused hurt can be powerful ways to live out Stephen's final act of mercy. In this way, the feast becomes not only a remembrance of a great saint but also an opportunity for spiritual renewal.


