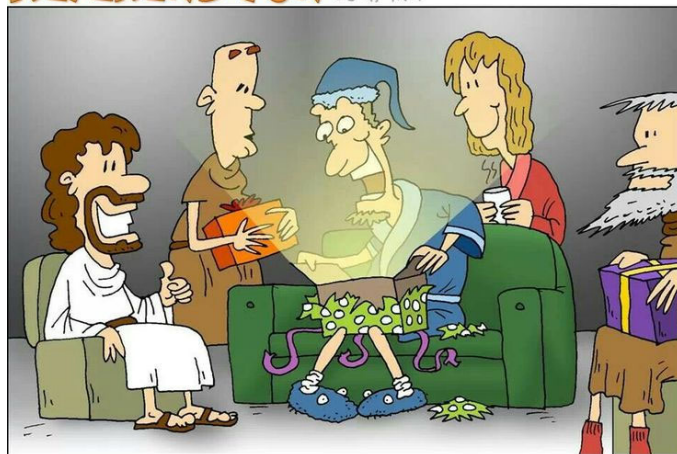

Feast Day: **December 27**

The Feast of St. John the Apostle and Evangelist, celebrated on December 27, honors the beloved disciple of Jesus—one of the Twelve Apostles and the author traditionally associated with the Gospel of John, three epistles, and the Book of Revelation. St. John holds a unique place in salvation history as the disciple “whom Jesus loved,” present at key moments of Christ’s life, including the Transfiguration, the Last Supper, and the Crucifixion. At the foot of the Cross, Jesus entrusted Mary to John, symbolizing John’s role as a spiritual son of the Mother of God and, by extension, a spiritual father to the Church.

St. John’s Gospel stands apart from the others for its deeply theological and poetic tone. Rather than focusing primarily on parables and miracles, John emphasizes the mystery of Christ as the eternal Word made flesh. His writings invite believers into a profound contemplation of God’s love, light, and truth. Central to John’s message is the commandment of love—love of God and love of neighbor—which remains foundational to Christian life. His emphasis on abiding in Christ continues to shape Catholic spirituality and theology.

Catholics can celebrate the Feast of St. John by attending Mass and reflecting on the Gospel proclaimed that day, which often highlights John’s witness to Christ’s divinity. Reading passages from the Gospel of John—such as the Prologue (“In the beginning was the Word”)—is a meaningful way to enter into the heart of his message. Taking time for quiet prayer and Scripture meditation allows believers to grow in intimacy with Christ, just as John did.

A traditional custom associated with this feast is the blessing of wine, recalling a legend in which St. John was unharmed after drinking poisoned wine. Some Catholic families mark the day by having a priest bless wine or by sharing a modest glass at home, offering prayers for health, joy, and fidelity to Christ. This practice emphasizes gratitude and trust in God’s protection and providence. The feast also invites Catholics to imitate St. John’s love and faithfulness. Acts of charity—especially toward those who feel lonely, misunderstood, or forgotten—are fitting ways to honor the apostle who remained close to Jesus in times of suffering. Writing a note of encouragement, visiting someone in need, or offering reconciliation within families reflects John’s message that “God is love.”

Finally, the Feast of St. John encourages believers to deepen their relationship with Mary, whom John welcomed into his home. Praying the Rosary, especially the Luminous Mysteries, or offering a Marian prayer can be a beautiful way to live out this aspect of John’s legacy. By celebrating this feast with prayer, Scripture, charity, and devotion, Catholics are reminded that they too are called to rest close to the heart of Christ and to bear witness to His love in the world.

The **2 turtle doves** were the Old & New Testaments

The **3 French hens** stood for faith, hope, and love.

The **4 calling birds** were the four gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John.

The **5 golden rings** rerepresented the first five books of the Old Testament

The **6 geese a-laying** stood for the six days of creation.

7 swans a-swimming represented the sevenfold gifts of the Holy Spirit----Prophecy, Serving, Teaching,

Exhortation, Contribution, Leadership, and Mercy.

The **8 maids a-milking** were the eight beatitudes.

9 ladies dancing were the nine fruits of the Holy Spirit----Charity, Joy, Peace, Patience [Forbearance], Goodness [Kindness], Mildness, Fidelity, Modesty, Continency [Chastity].

The **10 lords a-leaping** were the Ten Commandments.

The **11 pipers** piping stood for the eleven faithful Apostles.

The **12 drummers drumming** symbolized the twelve points of belief in The Apostles' Creed.
