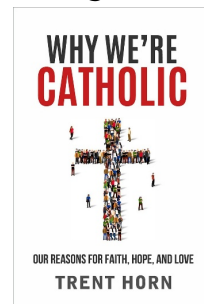

This Week's Featured Feast Day



The Baptism of the Lord

The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord marks the final celebration of the Christmas season in the Catholic Church and commemorates the moment when Jesus was baptized by John the Baptist in the Jordan River. This event is significant because, although Jesus was without sin, He chose to enter into the waters with sinners to show solidarity with humanity. At His Baptism, the heavens opened, the Holy Spirit descended like a dove, and the Father's voice declared Jesus as His beloved Son. This revelation is one of the clearest moments in Scripture where the Holy Trinity is manifested.

Theologically, the Baptism of the Lord highlights the beginning of Jesus' public ministry. It marks the transition from His hidden life in Nazareth to His mission of preaching, healing, and ultimately redeeming humanity. The feast also reminds Catholics of the power and purpose of their own baptism. Through baptism, Christians are cleansed from original sin, become members of the Body of Christ, and are called to live as children of God. This connection between Jesus' baptism and our own gives the feast deep spiritual meaning.

Catholics can celebrate this feast day first and foremost by attending Mass and reflecting prayerfully on the Gospel account. Hearing the Scriptures proclaimed allows the faithful to meditate on Christ's humility and obedience. Spending time in silent prayer or Eucharistic adoration can be a powerful way to invite the Holy Spirit to renew one's heart and deepen awareness of God's presence. Priests often bless holy water on or near this day, reminding the faithful of the sacramental grace tied to water and cleansing.

Another meaningful way to celebrate is to revisit one's own baptismal commitments. Families may choose to locate baptismal certificates, photos, or sacramental candles and share stories about the day each member was baptized. Parents can teach children the meaning of baptism, the role of godparents, and the importance of belonging to the Church. Making the Sign of the Cross with holy water when entering or leaving church can also be done with renewed intention on this feast.

Finally, the feast calls Catholics to live out their baptism in daily life. This means striving to love God and neighbor more faithfully, resisting sin, and seeking to grow in virtue. Acts of service—especially toward the poor, lonely, or forgotten—can become a living witness to the dignity received in baptism. By remembering that baptism not only marks belonging but also mission, Catholics celebrate this feast day by recommitting themselves to follow Christ more closely and to be His light in the world.

This Weekend's Mass Readings

BAPTISM OF THE LORD

Theme: The Servant of Yahweh. Every time we discover a new aspect in the person we love, we stop in wonderment. "I did not know him/her as such!" And this deeper insight and sharing in a person's self results in greater appreciation, intimacy, and love. Today we celebrate the Lord's baptism by John in the Jordan. Matthew relates Jesus' baptism as another epiphany (manifestation), declaring that the Lord Jesus is the servant (Son) of Yahweh. His call in life is that of the Servant as depicted in today's first reading. This is an aspect of Jesus' personality which gives us a deeper insight into who our Lord is. He is "the man for others." He is there for you and me.

Experiencing this in prayer, we should appreciate and love our Lord more for it. We each have our own calling in life. We must respond to it in the framework of our personal capabilities and the circumstances of time and milieu. Serious and mature people understand that only a life of service is a meaningful life. What do you consider your main calling in life, and how do you fulfill it?

"Almighty, eternal God... keep us, your children born of water and the Spirit, faithful to our calling". Today's feast marks the end of the Christmas season.

FIRST READING: Isaiah 42:1-4,6-7 [Works of the Messiah]

It is not clear what kind of person the inspired poet had in mind when he depicted an ideal servant of God in the four "Servant Songs," as we have them in Isaiah. Is it the whole nation of Israel? Is it some prophet or king of the past? Is it a Messiah (Anointed King) to come?

Reapplied by the evangelists and the Church, the Servant is identified with Jesus, who is manifested as God's beloved Servant (Son) in his baptism. The song depicts what the Lord Jesus' mission is to all of us. Reapplied by the Church, the psalm refers to the voice of God "over the waters," when Jesus was baptized in the Jordan.

SECOND READING: Acts 10:34-38 [Anointed To Do Good]

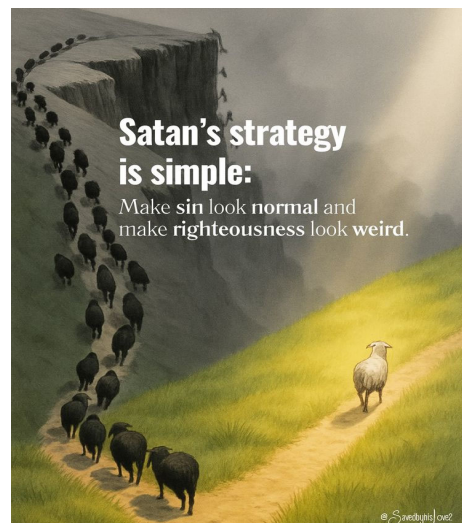
Peter sees Jesus as in his baptism "anointed... with the Holy Spirit and power" and so equipped for his calling: doing good works and healing all who were in the grip of the devil.

A similar calling is ours as baptized Christians. Being a Christian does not mean just avoiding sin. We are anointed to do good and to be concerned about other human beings who are in the grip of evil. And God will be with you!

GOSPEL: Matthew 3:13-17 [Beloved Son]

Jesus himself did not need a baptism of repentance, but by going to John he set an example for others. The voice from heaven confirms Jesus' mission. Matthew's wording is very close to that of the first Bible reading. He tells in his way that Jesus is in fact that "Servant of Yahweh," as depicted there.

Relate the Gospel and first Bible reading to your calling as a baptized Christian!
