John is forever glorified in Heaven, and in the end, that is all that truly matters. As we honor John's unwavering faith, seek to embrace God's permissive will in your own life. This Week's Featured Feast Day



Feast Day: **January 31st**

St. John Bosco, also known as Don Bosco, was born in 1815 in Becci, Italy, into a poor farming family. After his father's death when John was just two years old, his mother, Margaret Bosco, played a crucial role in shaping his faith, character, and deep compassion for the poor. From a young age, John showed a remarkable ability to connect with other children, often entertaining them with magic tricks, juggling, and stories—always ending with a prayer or a lesson from the Gospel. These early experiences revealed his lifelong vocation to bring young people closer to Christ through kindness, joy, and trust.

As a young man, John Bosco discerned a call to the priesthood and was ordained in 1841. Upon arriving in Turin, he encountered large numbers of neglected and homeless boys who had come to the city seeking work during the Industrial Revolution. Many were vulnerable to crime, exploitation, and spiritual neglect. Deeply moved by their plight, Don Bosco began gathering them on Sundays for prayer, catechesis, and recreation, laying the foundation for what would become the Oratory of St. Francis de Sales. His approach combined firm moral guidance with genuine affection, creating a safe and loving environment for youth.

Central to Don Bosco's mission was what he called the "Preventive System" of education, which emphasized reason, religion, and loving-kindness rather than punishment. He believed that young people flourished when they felt valued and understood. Don Bosco encouraged frequent reception of the sacraments, devotion to the Eucharist, and a tender love for the Blessed Virgin Mary, especially under the title of Mary Help of Christians. His spirituality was practical and joyful, teaching that holiness was attainable through daily duties done with love.

To sustain and expand his work, St. John Bosco founded the Salesians of Don Bosco, a religious congregation dedicated to the education and evangelization of youth. He also co-founded the Daughters of Mary Help of Christians with St. Mary Mazzarello to serve young women. Through schools, workshops, and missions, his charism spread rapidly throughout Italy and eventually across the world. Even amid financial struggles, illness, and opposition, Don Bosco trusted deeply in God's providence.

St. John Bosco died on January 31, 1888, and was canonized in 1934. He is recognized as the patron saint of youth, apprentices, editors, and educators. His legacy lives on wherever young people are formed not only academically but also spiritually and morally. Don Bosco's life remains a powerful witness to the transformative impact of patient love, cheerful faith, and unwavering dedication to Christ.

Catholics can celebrate the feast day of St. John Bosco on January 31 by praying for young people, educators, and families. Attending Mass, especially with an intention for youth ministry, is a meaningful way to honor him. Families and parishes can host joyful gatherings that include games, music, and fellowship, reflecting Don Bosco's belief in holiness through joy. Reading about his life, supporting Salesian missions, or performing acts of kindness toward young people in need are practical ways to live out his spirit. Above all, Catholics can imitate St. John Bosco by showing patience, encouragement, and Christ-centered love to the young people God places in their lives.

Notice of Deadline for Filing Claims: February 2, 2026

**YOU MAY HAVE A SEXUAL ABUSE CLAIM OR OTHER CLAIM
AGAINST THE ROMAN CATHOLIC BISHOP OF FRESNO**

On July 1, 2025, The Roman Catholic Bishop of Fresno aka the Diocese of Fresno filed a chapter 11 bankruptcy petition for protection under title 11 of the United States Code.

If you were sexually abused by any person connected with the Diocese, you must file a claim so as to be received by February 2, 2026, or otherwise you will be forever barred, estopped, and enjoined from asserting such claim against the Diocese.

Claims based on acts or omissions of the Diocese that occurred before July 1, 2025, must be filed on or before February 2, 2026, even if such claims are not now fixed, liquidated, or uncertain or did not mature or become fixed, liquidated, or certain before July 1, 2025.
